Police Aide Dies



EDWARD SHEERAN

While undergoing an operation, Edward B. Sheeran, 38, Bergen County police clerk-stenographer, died Wednesday at Base 81 Veterans Hospital, and the news of his passing cast a pal of gloom over the entire department. He was a veteran of the Pacific warfare in World War II and suffered his injury in the Guam fighting.

Married and father of two daughters, Sheeran lived at 19 East Ward Street, Hackensack. He joined the Bergen County department May 20, 1937, obtaining a leave of absence when he enlisted in the Marine Corps, May 17, 1944. He suffered a head wound while serving on Guam and was returned to the states for discharge Oct. 16, 1945.

Born Sept. 29, 1907 in New York City, Sheeran would have passed his thirty-ninth birthday within two weeks. He had lived in Hackensack about 20 years.

The funeral will be held at 10 Monday morning from the Hill and Steward Funeral Home, Central Avenue, and State Street, Hackensack. A High Requiem Mass will be celebrated a half hour later in Holy Trinity R. C. Church, Hackensack, and burial will be in St. Joseph's Cemetery, Hackensack.

Fellow members of the Capt. Harry B. Doremus Post No. 55 American Legion, will conduct memorial services at the funeral home at 8 Sunday evening.

Survivors are his wife, Ethel Scudder Sheeran; and two daughters, Florence, 16, and Eileen, 11.
