re-enlisted May 16, 1915 at Hackensack.
Received marksmanship in 1915 and
Sharpshooter in 1916. Mexican
Border Service 1916.

Made Corporal August 4, 1917 at
Pompton, New Jersey. Honorably
Discharged Jan. 25, 1918 at
Camp McClellan, Anniston, Ala.
Reenlisted May 27, 1918 at Hackensack
appointed Corporal July 10, 1918 at
Camp Dix. Appointed Sert. on
August 2, 1918 at Camp Dix.
Died in the Service, Oct. 4, 1918
at Camp Dix, Hightstown, N. J.
